Pop-In 2025

About 25yrs ago Open Door started as a coffee morning on a Tuesday as lunches were held in Hillside Hall. This was run by Margot T and Ann C. Margot took over as leader with the help of a few volunteers, and we added in tabletop & cake sales. In late 2021 Bev became leader assisted by Lois, Margaret and a growing number of kind volunteers who give up their precious time to make it the success it has become. By this time the name had changed to Pop-In. When the cost-of-living crisis first became apparent in early 2023 Wiltshire Council were asking for Warm Spaces to be set up in towns and villages across the County. So we started to offer soup & rolls as well as coffee, and made it known to people in the community that RWBMC is open for anyone who needs a warm space for a few hours on a Tuesday. When Spring came folk wanted it to continue so we changed the menu and this is how Tuesday Pop-In is today.

We start at 10am and offer coffee & biscuits and lots of chat followed by lunch at 12pm. Some folk come just for coffee, others lunch and some stay all morning, we have up to 30 for lunch. Whatever you choose, a warm welcome is given.

Over the last couple of years we have had Christmas parties, hot cross buns, pancakes, Jubilee & Coronation Celebrations & cream teas. At our Christmas Party this year we had the pleasure of a visit from Longleaze Pre School who sang Christmas songs for us & stayed for drinks and biscuits. We also had a Christmas jumper/hat competition and a lovely buffet. It was great fun.

There is no charge for lunch, we are grateful for donations to cover the cost of food, and anything left goes back to local groups in our community. For example, Brownies, Cubs, Scouts, The Rise Trust, RWB Primary schools for library books, Foodbank, Messy Church, Filling Station, Longleaze Pre School, Allsorts Nursery, GWH, Vale View Community Garden & RWBMC have all received a donation from RWBMC Pop-In.

A huge thankyou goes out to our volunteer helpers without whom we couldn't manage. If you have a few hours free even once a month or if you have or would be interested in getting your Food Hygiene Certificate (which would enable you to help in the kitchen), please contact Bev.
